Information for Contributors

- 1. Papers are accepted for publication in Geoinformatics, Journal of Japan Society of Geoinformatics that is concerned with the application and use of mathematics, statistics and computers in the earth science. Manuscript should be original.
- Submission is a representation that the manuscript has not been published previously and is not currently under consideration for publication elsewhere.
 A statement transferring copyright from the authors to Japan Society of Geoinformatics will be required before the manuscript can be accepted for publication. The Editor-in-Chief will supply the necessary forms for this transfer.
- 3. Type double-spaced on one side of the paper, submit the original and one copy (including copies of all illustrations and figures).
- 4. All manuscripts should be in English. Papers should be no longer than 5000 words; papers of less than 1500 words may be considered as Short Articles or Notes.
- 5. An abstract is to be provided, preferably no longer than 300 words.
- 6. A list of 3-8 key words is to be provided directly below the abstract. Key words should express the precise content of the manuscript, as they are used for indexing purposes, both internal and external. The key words should not duplicate words in the title.
- 7. Illustrations (photographs, drawing diagrams, maps and chart) are to be numbered in one consecutive series of Arabic numerals and referred to by number in the text. Captions for illustrations should be typed on a separate sheet of papers. Original drawings, good-quality photographic prints or computer printouts are acceptable. Drawings should be prepared with black ink. Photographs should be large, glossy prints, showing good contrast. Computer printouts should be on unlined paper with good contrast of black print on white background. Color illustrations will be charged depending on printing cost.

All symbols are to be explained; map must have a scale. Weights and measures should be expressed in the metric system. All illustrations are to be identified on the back with the authors's name and number of illustration.

- 8. Tables should be numbered consecutively in Arabic numerals and referred to by number in the text. Each table should be typed on a separate sheet of paper.
- 9. List references alphabetically at the end of the paper and refer to them in the test by name and years in parentheses. Where three or more authors are involved, only the first author's name is given in the text followed by et al.

References must be complete, including the names of all authors, title of paper, volume and number of journal or bulletin, and page range.
